SUBJECT: Acceptance of Quitclaim for Sewer Line at 2477 Arnold Industrial Way.

**BACKGROUND:** 

During construction of CCCTA's administration and maintenance facilities on Arnold Industrial Way, a dedicated sewer line was installed that runs west to east through CCCTA's property. This line services CCCTA's administration building, fuel island, and maintenance

building.

Once CCCTA occupied the facility, this sewer line

should have become CCCTA's property and

responsibility. During the upgrade to the waste water separator in 2009 at the fuel island, it was discovered that the Contra Costa County Sanitary District (CCCSD) retained ownership and an easement to this line.

**SUMMARY OF ISSUES:** 

It is CCCSD's policy to relinquish ownership and future maintenance responsibility to the owners of the property on which the sewer facilities exist. On April 1, 2010, the CCCSD Board of Directors adopted resolutions to relinquish the public sewer at 2477 Arnold Industrial Way and quitclaim the associated easement. In order to finalize this transaction, the CCCTA's Board of Directors

must accept the quitclaim deed by resolution.

BACKGROUND:

Since 2007/08 CCCTA has been the beneficiary of a Homeland Security Grant with the purpose of upgrading the security at the CCCTA facility

located at 2477 Arnold Industrial Way, Concord, California.

quickly restrict access to unauthorized individuals.

SUMMARY OF ISSUES:

With the Homeland Security Grant in hand we have done extensive interviews and research and come to the conclusion that a proximity card security system, if implemented, would increase the security and safety for CCCTA

and its staff.

The system we have chosen was developed by the Siemens Industry. This system was sourced through the State CMAS contract. We along with our legal advisors negotiated a contract that will upgrade our current system. The system we are proposing would switch the mechanism for opening a locked door from the traditional key to a proximity card/employee ID. This system would allow CCCTA to authorize access to individuals based on job requirements, and allow CCCTA to monitor employee and visitor traffic based on time of day and area access. This system would also allow staff to

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS: The negotiated contract with the Siemens Industries is for \$321,467.05. The Homeland Security Grant has provided us with \$319,320,00 the additional fund would be provided with TDA funds budgeted for facility security

purposes.

SUBJECT: Leased Tires and Related Services Contract

#### BACKGROUND:

The Central Contra Costa Transit Authority leases the tires on the revenue vehicles. Every five (5) years, the maximum term allowed by the Federal Transit Administration, the CCCTA goes to bid for a renewal contract. Traditionally, there have only been two (2) companies interested in and capable of pursuing a contract for this service. Those two companies are The Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company ("Goodyear") and The Firestone Tire and Rubber Company ("Firestone"). The CCCTA has, with one contract term exception, contracted with Goodyear for this service since beginning full service in 1982.

#### SUMMARY OF ISSUES:

An Invitation For Bids (IFB) was issued on June 29, 2010 to seek a new contract for this service. On the bid opening date of August 20, 2010, one bid was received. That bid was from Goodyear. Firestone had previously issued a letter stating that it did not intend to bid on our IFB.

The Authority is in need of a contract for the continued supply of tires for the revenue buses. The advantage to having a tire company under contract for the supply of tires provides the CCCTA with a guarantee of tires in the event of a materials shortage for the production of bus tires. Although the Authority received a single bid, the cost analysis did show that the Goodyear bid was fair and equitable. Staff is recommending that the committee proceed with approving the submitted bid and requesting the Board of Directors to authorize the General Manager to enter into a contract with Goodyear for a five (5) year contract for Leased Tires and Related Services.

#### **OPTION 1:**

That CCCTA award a contract to The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company for Leased Tires and Related Services.

#### **OPTION 2:**

The O&S Committee direct staff to re-advertise the procurement.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The bid submitted by Goodyear lists two rates; one for large tires (.006075/mile for the first year) for the 35' and 40' coaches and a different rate for the smaller tires (.007100/mile for the first year) on the 29' coaches. The Service rate for the first year of the new contract is \$5,200/month. The IFB response contains fixed rates for each of the five years of the contract period.

The first year annual financial implication will be a decrease in tire costs of \$25,220.00, which is a decrease of 15.80%. And an increase of \$100.00 for Services, which is a 2% increase. After the first year, the rates bid show the following percentage increases:

Second Year 4.5% for tires and 3.8% for Service Third Year 4.6% for tires and 4.1% for Service Fourth Year 4.5% for tires and 4.0% for Service Fifth Year 4.5% for tires and 4.3% for Service

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

Staffs recommends that the O&S Committee recommend award of a five (5) year contract to The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company at the guaranteed rates specified in their bid of August 20, 2010.

SUBJECT: New Route to CSU - RM2 Funded

#### SUMMARY OF ISSUES:

A proposal was discussed at the last O&S meeting whereby a new route would be developed to serve the Cal State Uuniversity East Bay (CSU) campus using the service hours currently used on the 98X.

The most productive corridor for a new route to CSU is Clayton Road and routing along this corridor has the best chance of meeting the farebox recovery criteria for continued RM2 funding. Staff has developed a schedule for the new route that uses the same number of hours as the 98X. Details are shown below:

First trip departs BART Concord at 7:15am

Last trip departs CSU at 10:12pm

Headways: 30 minute in the peak and 60 minute mid-day and

late night

A public hearing was held for a new route 10X in January when a plan was developed to replace the 98X with a new route, the 10X. Because the Board did not support elimination of the 98X, MTC didn't allow RM2 funds to be shifted. The public hearing solicited comment on a new route from Concord BART via Clayton Road to CSU. There was no negative public comment. We will have to conduct a public hearing to eliminate the 98X.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Staff recommends that the Committee support a plan to eliminate the 98X and replace it with a new route connecting BART Concord to CSU via Clayton Road. Staff recommends that the Committee support communication with MTC that this plan be the "fix" to enable RM2 funds to continue to flow. Staff also recommends that a public hearing be conducted on

#### Analysis

Average weekday ridership in July (10,662 passengers) dropped from the prior months ridership of 10,797 per average weekday. See the attached table showing weekday boardings trend. Productivity in July was equal to 13.7 passengers per hour as compared to June's figure of 14.3 passengers per hour. The most productive routes remain the #20, #4, #10, and the 600 series of school tripper routes. A table showing the ranking of route by productivity is attached.

The percentage of missed trips was equal to 0.09% in July, up from the prior month, but still well within the goal set by the Board (0.25%). The YTD average is 0.09% missed trips.

The number of miles between roadcalls was equal to 23,947 miles which is slightly lower than prior month performance of 26,925 miles between roadcalls.
